MLA urges relief for distressed tobacco farmers

HUNSUR

G. D. Harish Gowda has urged the State government to take immediate steps to support tobacco growers facing severe losses due to a sharp fall in prices. He raised the issue during the Assembly session, highlighting the financial distress of farmers in several regions.

He said nearly 50,000 farmer families depend on tobacco cultivation in areas like Hunsur, Periyapatna, H.D. Kote, K.R. Nagar, and Arakalagodu. Despite producing good quality crops, farmers are struggling as market prices have dropped significantly in recent months.

According to him, tobacco prices fell from ₹278 per kg in January to ₹262 in February and further to ₹243 in March. Meanwhile, the cost of production remains around ₹185 per kg, leaving farmers with heavy losses.

He also pointed to a recent incident where a farmer from Hunsur allegedly attempted suicide due to financial stress, calling it a serious warning sign. He urged the government to provide a support price for tobacco and include the crop under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana to ensure insurance coverage.

Harish Gowda said that al-



Harish Gowda criticized the State for excluding tobacco from support prices and insurance, urged independent action, and suggested ₹25-₹35 per kg compensation, citing Andhra Pradesh 2015

though the Centre announces support prices for several crops, tobacco is not included. He demanded that the State government take independent action instead of waiting for central decisions.

Referring to a similar situation in Andhra Pradesh in 2015, he suggested providing compensation of ₹25 to ₹35 per kg to farmers. He criticized the State for not implementing the crop insurance scheme for tobacco, saying it is unfair to farmers and urged immediate corrective action.
